The Resilience Project supports wellbeing through lessons on gratitude, empathy, and mindfulness, helping students build positive mental health and emotional awareness. Student resource books are used to support explicit teaching, guided practice, and consolidation of learning around wellbeing themes. All students will also be provided with a 'student diary' which contains meaningful activities and a log for daily reading. (Resource book \$25, diary \$10) PR1ME Mathematics is a program, supported by student resource books, which systematically maps out the teaching and learning program in maths from P-6. PR1ME is supported by daily explicit direct instruction in the classroom. (Resource books (2) \$35)	\$85
Spelling Mastery provides structured lessons to effectively, efficiently, and explicitly teach the spelling skills students need to become proficient readers and writers. Spelling Mastery is also supported by a student resource book. (Resource book \$15)

O Compass	Make payments using a credit card, allows you to have an individual child's payment record within the app. Individual login access required. Contact the office for details.
Cash, Cheque, EFTPOS	Payments can be made at our School Office in person or over the phone.
Camps Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)	Applications can be made at the School Office until June for this yearly fund. Forms are available from the office.
Pay It Forward Fund	Students are assessed on a case-by-case basis. Contact student wellbeing for further information.
BPay BAY	Contact the school office for the Biller Code and your unique family reference number.

Refunds

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities:

Students withdrawing from camps and excursions, optional item activities will not automatically be entitled to a refund.

- Full refund/credit on family account will be applicable where NO COST is incurred by the school.
- Camps:
 - Full refund/credit on family account will be applicable where NO COST is incurred by the school.
 - Where a cost is incurred by the school, a medical certificate is required for the period of the activity before a refund is considered. The refund will be the amount paid less any expenses incurred by the school because of the withdrawal.

Other Contributions:

Other contributions are refundable when paid in the preceding year and the student does not commence the school year.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
